#### **Superintendent's Report**

Mr. Hall reported the District underwent a Medicaid Claim Review through the Special Education Department.

Mr. Halll took the opportunity to congratulate Marlene Lennox and Carol Barkley for doing an outstanding job to see that the District passed with "flying colors."

Mr. Hall reported that Mayor Vince Battista phoned and wanted to let the District know he looks forward to the Village and the school District continuing to work in collaboration. Mr. Battista also wanted to wish a Merry Christmas to the Board of Education.

Mr. Hall reported the District has five students participating in Youth Court. There will be an Induction Ceremony on December 30th which will include Sarah Grey, Alan Wilson, Kayla Sova, Shea Lynch, and Hannah Oram.

Mr. Hall reported receiving notice that schools are no longer able to issue Child Model Permits. These permits will now be issued through the New York State Division of Labor.

Mr. Hall reported the Food Service Department will be going through a Breakfast/Lunch Audit Review in the near future. During the audit process, inventory, donated foods, free & reduced lunch applications will be reviewed.

Mr. Hall reported community donations for the Holiday Season is tremendous.

Mr. Hall reported receiving a \$138.45 check for our participation in Energy Curtailment. Mr. Hall reported the District received artifacts from Lillian Alexander, Copenhagen. These documents were in family storage and wanted the District to have. Mr. Hall passed around the artifacts and will be placing them in the Board of Education Conference Room.

Mr. Hall reported he would be attending a Fort Drum RISE Executive Committee Meeting. Mr. Hall indicated Guidance Counselors will be going to Syracuse University to review accelerated course options.

Mr. Hall reported the Boys' and Girls' had their Scholar Athlete Recognition Luncheon on Friday, December 6, 2013. The average for the girls' was 94.65 and the average for the boys' was 94.8.

Mr. Hall reported the Elementary Holiday Concert on December 4 went well.

Mr. Hall reported the Secondary Holiday Concert will be held on December 18. Mr. Hall also reported that Mr. Buell is back to work full time.

Mr. Hall reported he attended a FDRLO Meeting on December 5. At this meeting, Mr. Hall was informed that school districts across the nation with military connections are rated to determine if AYP (Adequate Yearly Progress) has been met. The Education Consultant reported that all 18 schools in our consortium received AYP on a National front.

Mr. Hall reported he would be attending a FDELC Meeting on December 11, 2013 in Watertown.

## Principal's Report

Ms. Gaffney reported the District received a check in the amount of \$392.50 from All American Publishing Company for the athletic posters they publish.

Ms. Gaffney reported the District has been selected to participate in the National Assessment Educational Progress. On February 25, 2014, Grade 8 students will participate in the assessment. Ms. Gaffney will be notifying parents this week and parents can opt out by January 10, 2014.

Ms. Gaffney reported there was a 98 percent attendance at the elementary level for Parent/Teacher Conferences.

Ms. Gaffney reported Anti-Bullying Week was a great success. Students marched around the block with a banner pledging against bullying. Ms. Gaffney took the opportunity to share pictures with the Board of Education.

Ms. Gaffney reported the District may need to post for a Modified Softball Coach after January.

Ms. Gaffney took the opportunity to thank the Board of Education for reconsidering cheerleading for this school year. Even though there was not enough interest for this year there seems to be an interest for next year.

Ms. Gaffney reported she is now a Dignity for All Trainer. Her first training involved 130 people in Potsdam.
